Since 1969, Lighthouse Youth Services has been a beacon of hope for abused and neglected children and for families in crisis. Lighthouse provides residential care each day for more than 400 children in our foster homes, group homes, juvenile corrections center, supervised apartments, and other residential programs. Children of all ages come to us...from infants to older youth.

Each day Lighthouse social workers provide in-home services to over 1,000 families. Our staff of more than 350 full and part-time employees, assisted by some 200 volunteers, is a beacon of hope, bringing brighter lives to youth and families.
