# Helping Young People Thrive Fiscal Year 2023



Lighthouse foster parents cared for 230 children.



837 young people received outpatient mental health services.



Mecum House welcomed 419 10-17 year olds seeking safety.



Youth Housing Opportunities supported **376** young adults in their efforts to achieve independence.



67 youth were nurtured at Lighthouse's Cincinnati residential treatment locations.



290 young adults found shelter and services at the Sheakley Center for Youth.

# "LIGHTHOUSE MADE ME WHO I AM TODAY."

"I was 13 years old when I entered the child welfare system and found myself at Lighthouse's Mecum House. From there, I moved to the Lighthouse Youth Development Center (YDC), a residential treatment home for boys. YDC was my home for three years. The staff were mother figures to me, and when I got into some trouble, they didn't give up on me. I did well at YDC, and when I was 17, I joined the Lighthouse Independent Living Program, an opportunity for youth aging out of the child welfare system to learn to live independently. I moved into a furnished apartment and received the support I needed to prepare for my future as an adult. Today, I have a full-time job and am doing well on my own. Lighthouse helped me every step of the way, and I appreciate that they were always there for me."





# "I'M GRATEFUL LIGHTHOUSE WAS THERE FOR ME."

"I was 18, alone, and on the streets. Soon after becoming homeless, I was forced into sex trafficking to survive. I was addicted to heroin and became involved in an abusive relationship—the latest episode in a long history of physical and emotional abuse. When I finally decided to escape, I found a Lighthouse Street Outreach worker. The worker helped me and took me to the Lighthouse Sheakley Center for Youth. There, the staff worked immediately to get me treatment for substance abuse and other services and support I needed to recover and become independent." – Annie
